



THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND



BLACK ICE

Black ice is a thin coating of ice on the road surface, invisible to the naked eye. Occurring in winter months. Black ice causes the road surface to become slippery.



AGRICULTURAL MACHINERY

Agricultural machinery such as tractors, irrigators and trucks move slowly along farm areas. Riders must obey road marking at all times. Local farmers are encouraged to show courtesy and find a safe place to pull over if they hold up traffic.



MOSS

Moss is found near and around gorge areas and rainforests. It can settle on the road edge causing slippery conditions



GRAVEL

Gravel is used on road edges in Kentish. Traffic causes some gravel to build up on the road surface resulting in less traction for riders.



WILDLIFE

Wildlife is abundant in the forested parts of Kentish and animals frequent the road, especially at dawn and dusk. Riders need to factor in wildlife and roadkill being on the road surface.

MUD

Mud in winter months accumulates on the road from farm machinery causing slippery conditions for riders.



BUSES

Buses travel the Kentish roads all times of the day, particularly school buses during school terms. When a bus has its lights flashing road users MUST slow to 40km/h.

To identify your location simply find the nearest power pole and quote the pole identification number.

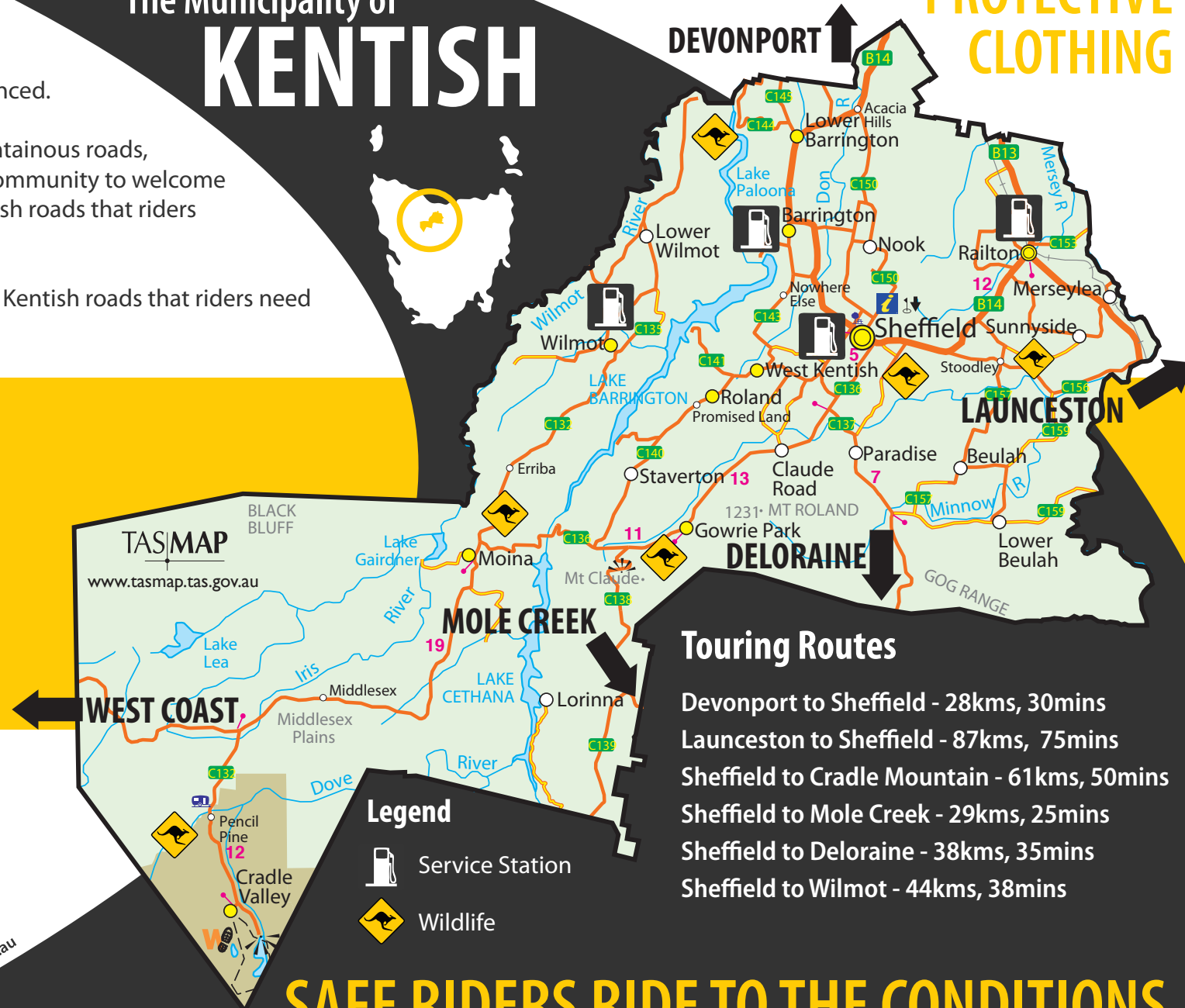
